## Speaker Biographies

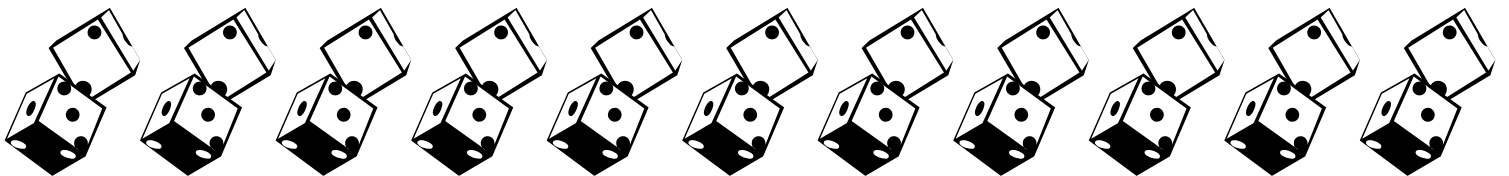

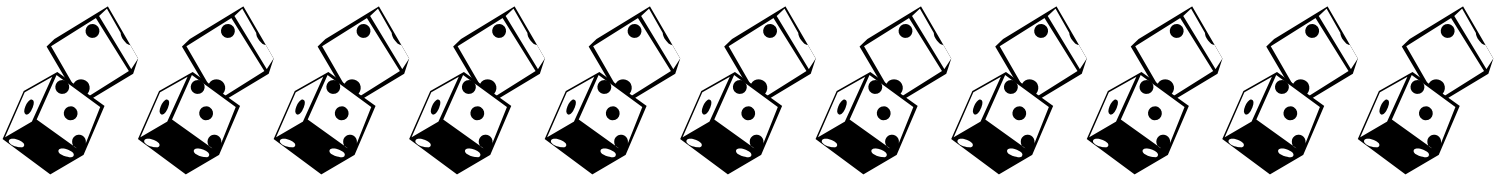
### **ODONA/LTC Membership Information**

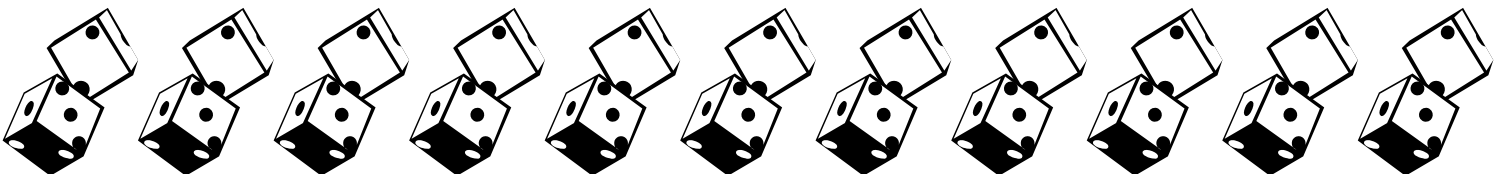

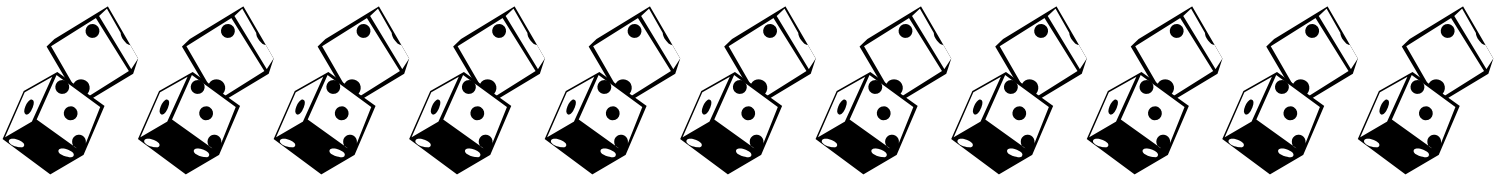
